### **Quick Reference Guide**

A SPCC Plan documenting oil storage overfill protection, secondary containment, operating procedures, periodic inspections, spill mitigation and reporting procedures and employee training is required for any facility that has a total above ground oil storage capacity greater than 1,320 gallons in containers 55-gallons or more and/or a total underground oil storage tank capacity greater than 42,000 gallons, and the facility could potentially discharge oil into navigable waters in quantities that may be harmful.

Oil of any type and in any form is covered, including but not limited to petroleum, fuel oil, sludge, oil refuse, oil mixed with wastes, fats, animal/fish oils or greases, vegetable oils, mineral oils and synthetic oils.

EPA recently revised the definition of "Waters of the United States", clarifying the meaning of traditional navigable waters. This rule was published on April 21, 2020 and became effective on June 22, 2020.

SPCC Plans must be reviewed every 5 years and be updated each time changes are made at the facility. Remember to consider Hurricane Harvey's 25-year, 24-hour rainfall for secondary containment freeboard.
